Scarlets shine ahead of semifinal

After having a 12-1 record and making it to the Class AAAAA Championship game in the 2022 season, Mankato West is off to a flying start in the 2023 season.

The Scarlets have a current record of 7-1, and when you look at what they are doing on both sides of the ball, their record shouldn't be a surprise to anyone.

They are holding opponents to 9.25 points per game and through the first eight games, they are averaging 32.25 points per game.

To this point, they have been able to find a balanced attack on offense. In the passing game, they are averaging 184.2 yards per game.

The leader in that department, senior quarterback Bart McAninch, has thrown all but one pass attempt this season for the Scarlets.

McAninch has thrown for 16 touchdowns, has four interceptions and has a quarterback rating of 108.5.

Star wide-receiver and Gopher commit Jalen Smith contributes to much of McAninch's success. Smith is nearing 500 receiving yards, and has seven touchdowns on the season.

As for the running game, they are averaging 129.8 yards per game. The Scarlets have also scored 15 touchdowns on the ground, and have only one fumble on the year.

Senior Carter Bersaw has been largely carrying the load in

the running game.

Bersaw has gotten 105 attempts, is averaging 71.4 yards per game and has four touchdowns. McAninch also has had his part to play in the run game as well.

He leads the team with eight rushing touchdowns.

Their most recent game came in a 28-0 win against Rogers. The Scarlets handed the Royals their first loss of the season Wednesday night. All 28

points were scored in the second quarter. McAninch threw for two touchdowns and ran for two more, which included a 27-yard rush into the end zone. He also found Bersaw for an 80-yard touchdown pass.

As the regular season has come to an end, up next for the Scarlets is the Section 2AAAAA Semifinal. The squad will host a 4-4 Chaska team at Mankato West High School Saturday, Oct. 28 at 3:00 p.m.

Mankato East men's soccer needed to win three section tournament games to head to the Minnesota State Tournament, the Cougars came up short in the last game.

With a 2-1 loss in the third game of the section tournament to Worthington High School, the Cougars season comes to a close. They finished the season as the section 2AA runner-up.

The boys got on the board early in the first half 21 minutes into the game.

They had some looks to put the ball into the back of the net but came up short on a few occasions but kept their 1-0 lead.

Worthington's leader in goals Jonathan Banegas came up big with a clutch kick with 1:06s remaining in the game. This tied the score 1-1.

The two teams then went down to the wire in a penalty kick shootout.

Worthington bested the Cougars in the penalty kick shootout and won the game 2-1. They sent Mankato East home and are now moving on to the Minnesota State Soccer Tournament.

"Extremely proud of the lads tonight, they left everything out on the field but came up short," head coach Jerrad Aspelund said via X.

Despite the loss, the Cougars had a successful season going 10-7-2 throughout the season.

Their largest victory came against Red Wing High School with a shutout of 5-0.


As the season concludes, the Cougars will be losing the



After the Mankato East women's soccer team finished the 2022 season with a third place tie, they are going back for redemption as they have another chance to make a run for the state title.

To conclude the women's regular season schedule, the Cougars defeated their town rival Mankato West in a 2-0

victory. This gives them a 14-4 overall record and a 8-3 conference record. Of their 14 wins, 11 of them were shutouts. They also average just about three goals per game.

"There were a lot of unknowns heading into this year," head coach Lizzy Vetter said. "We took every game head on, tried to make the most out of each game and win in the little moments. We were able to put together something really

special with a lot of new and returning players." Vetter says culture and tradition can be attributed to their success.

"Our willingness to want to continue our tradition and culture to keep the success that has been laid upon us," Vetter

The women's soccer team has five seniors who helped the team to its success and took on leadership roles.

"Our seniors, our returning



With the state tournament next for the Mankato East program, they look to finish out the year strong.

The schedule and seedings have not yet been determined but the games will take place from October 24 to November third. The Cougars will have the chance to represent Mankato East at U.S. Bank Stadium, the home of the Minnesota Vikings.

"We just want to continue to build what we've done here today," Vetter said. "You can only go 1-0 in the state tournament, you only get one chance or you are eliminated. We hope to continue to build, get one win and to be at U.S. Bank would be the dream."

After going 6-22 in their 2022 campaign, the Minnesota State volleyball team entered the 2023 season with something to prove – that they were better than what their record showed.

The Mavs were picked to finish tenth in the NSIC in the NSIC Preseason Coaches' Poll, as Elizabeth Dille was the Mavs' 'Player to Watch' for the 2023 season.

To this point in the season, they have proved their worth. They currently sit at 10-10, eighth in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Their most recent win came over the no. 10 ranked team in Division II volleyball, the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs.

"That was a gutsy win for us," said head coach Corey Phelps in a press release posted to the Maverick Athletics website. "I could not be prouder of this team. The team is figuring out how to step up in big moments. I can't think of a bigger moment than this."

Phelps is in his third season as head coach of the Mavs, and his expertise has helped the Mavs come together more as a group.

Stepping up in big moments

and against ranked teams has been something that these Mavs have thrived on. The NSIC is one of the tougher conferences in Division II. Five teams have found their way into the top-15 in DII, and the Mavs have been able to hang with teams like Concordia-St. Paul and even defeat the Bulldogs.

With the amount of competition in the NSIC, that also means that the Mavs need to take advantage of the games that they play against unranked teams. They have a 4-3 record against those unranked NSIC teams, and performed well, (5-3) at the Tiger Classic and Otter Invitational Volleyball challenges before they began conference play.

The Mavs have four players with over 100 kills on the year – senior Sophie Tietz (180), junior Kiya Durant (138), senior Emma Loveall (124) and junior Toryn Richards (123). Tietz also leads the team in service aces with 29. Sophomore Ellie Kline ranks second with 20. Brooke Bolwerk (452) and Makayla Snow (174) lead the way in assists.

As the Mavericks continue their season, they will have only six more games, all against unranked NSIC teams as they fight for their spot in the NSIC and NCAA Tournament.



Saints volleyball secures Big South East

15 wins, three losses and easily running away with the Big South East Conference.

The St. Peter Saints are winners of their last six games and have not lost consecutive games all year.

They began their season with four straight sweeps over Pipestone, Blue Earth, Fairmont and St. James before losing their first game in five sets to Mankato West. In their first game against Pipestone, they allowed only 25 total points.

After splitting their next two games against Mankato West and New Ulm, the Saints rattled off another four-game winning streak heading into the Century Invite.

The Saints went 3-1 in a tournament played in a 'bestof-three' format where they played Sartell, Mankato East, Watertown-Mayer and Alden-Conger.

Since their loss to Sartell in the late-September tournament, the Saints have lost only two total sets on their way to six straight wins. Additionally, their game that was scheduled to be played on October 10 against New Ulm was canceled and has yet to be made up.

Just as it was last season, the Saints are currently second in Section 4X, behind Marshall, who is the favorite to finish first.

"We hope to reach that milestone again this year," said Saints' head coach Carmen Hanson.


Last season, in the section 2AAA championship, the Tigers ended the Saints' playoff run with a sweep.

The Saints have outscored their opponents 1,104-855 on the season, have 67 more kills than their opponents, and have over 200 more digs. Two juniors have stolen the show for the Saints this year - Iris Elias and Emmy Remmert. Elias has reached 1,000 assists on top of her 10

kills, eight service aces and 55 digs. Remmert has 219 kills, six service aces and 75 digs. Senior Lauren Jacobsen is the team leader in service aces.

As the season winds down, the Saints look forward to their inevitable matchup with the Marshall Tigers as they push for the conference championship.

They will play Mankato East in their first playoff game, the Section 2AAA Quarterfinal at St. Peter high school on October

West girls place second in Section 2AA

The Mankato West girl's soccer team went into this season with head coach Crissy Makela incharge for her 28th season. In the 2022 season, the Scarlets had a record of 13-4-1. Heading into the 2023 season, they had a lot of turnover in their defense, and lost their top goal scorer, Julia Schumacher, from the previous year.

Despite the change of personnel in a number of key positions, Makela felt like the playing time that some players had last season would help ease into that role of having to replace the players that are no longer on the roster.

"We've always had the mentality even last year during the regular season we made sure all our players got playing time and that's intentional that way now come this year those players who were maybe not starters last year are still ready and know what a varsity level match is," Makela told KEYC.

The Scarlets 2023 season ended the same way the 2022 season did. A defeat at the hands of rivals Mankato East in the Section 2AA Championship. They finished the year with an overall record of 13-6. While they were able to not only cope, but improve with a new look defense. As they conceded 15 goals compared to the 16 opponents scored on them last season. Not having some of their top goal-scorers from a year ago proved to be a big miss on the

get 42 goals. Makela led the Scarlets in scoring this season, as the senior put the ball in the net 20 times.


